FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Today, as we continue our Lenten journey toward the great celebration of Easter, we turn our attention to the Transfiguration of the Lord. This event highlights the saving work of redemption: the Passion and Death

of Jesus leads to the glory of the Resurrection. Through the revelation of his glory — which shines in and through his human nature — Jesus wants us to possess true hope for all that lies in our future.

Jesus invites us into glory with him and goes ahead of us to show us the way – the way of the Cross. Just as Jesus entered willingly into his Passion, so we are invited to make the internal choice to enter willingly into the disciplines and sufferings of the Christian life. The penances that we embrace; the time that we spend in prayer; and the charity that we show to our neighbor are all ways that we die to our pride, our sin, and our selfish motivations. This way of suffering and mortification leads to the healing of our sin sick souls and increases our strength to grow in virtue and holiness.

The Transfiguration of the Lord invites us to listen to the beloved Son of the Father who teaches us, shows us, and walks with us on the road through death to glory. When we, like the apostles on the mountain, behold the glory of the Lord, we can find the strength to make the internal choice to follow him so that we may always desire and at last attain the glory revealed to us in Christ.

In the afternoon of today, the participants in our parish OCIA will be going to the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception for the Rite of Election and the Call to Continuing Conversion. We have four participants in our parish program who have been praying, learning, and growing as disciples of the Lord. The weekly formation classes have provided them with the rich teachings of our Catholic faith. The rites today are the proximate preparation for their Baptism, Confirmation, and reception of the Holy Eucharist. After the homily at the 10:30 Mass for the next three Sundays, we will accompany our Elect with the prayers of the Scrutinies. These are prayers that ask for God's power of deliverance from evil, help, and protection as they approach the Paschal feasts to find Christ in his sacraments. Please keep these people in your prayers as they make their final preparations.

The cleaning, repair, and restoration of the altar rail was completed this past week with the patching of some holes and the installation of a memorial plaque. Through the great generosity of personal friends, the altar rail was restored in memory of my parents and in gratitude for my priesthood. I am so grateful to God for my parents who first formed me in the Catholic faith – teaching me to pray, taking our family to Sunday Mass, and supporting me in my participation in church-related activities and ministries. (I joined the church choir when I was 11.) While my announcement that God was calling me to the priesthood and religious life as a Dominican was surprising to them, they never opposed my discernment and made efforts to understand what it all meant for me and for them. They were present here at St. Dominic's for the day of my ordination to the priesthood on May 20, 1994, along with my brothers and other family members. Throughout my priesthood, their love has been constant, and at times they challenged me with reasonable expectations of priestly life and witness. In their twilight years, as health deteriorated, they allowed me the privilege to fulfill the fourth commandment and care for them and their needs until death. I will be eternally grateful for the gift of their love, upbringing, provision, and support. Remembering them here at St. Dominic's enhances the gratitude in my heart.





Disposing of Blessed Palm Leaves


