PASTOR'S CORNER

Jesus speaks to us today through his words spoken on the night before his crucifixion and death. "This is my commandment: love one another as I love you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." The love that Jesus commands us to extend to one another is a sacrificial love. It is focused upon the goodness of the other person; it seeks the benefit of the other person. There is no selfishness.

Each of us learns to love in this way through our reception and experience of God's love. St. John teaches us today through his letter: "In this is love: not that we have loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as expiation for our sins" (1Jn 4:10). God takes the initiative to love us; we didn't earn it or deserve it. As St. Paul writes: "While we were still sinners Christ died for us" (Rom 5:8). God makes the sacrifice that brings the forgiveness of sins and the restoration of our goodness. Through Jesus, God affirms each of us as his son or daughter with all the unique gifts and qualities that we possess.

Hence, we have the grace to love one another because we do so with the love that God has poured into our hearts. The gift we have received we give as a gift to others. And divine love is never depleted. The more we love, the more we receive the love of God who makes us loving persons who are a gift and blessing to others.

Over the last 6 ½ years of my pastorate here at St. Dominic's, the parish has experienced the grace of renewal, restoration and growth. With the help of God's grace and the involvement of parishioners and volunteers, we continue to realize the vision of a "vibrant community of disciples of the Risen Lord Jesus." There is a momentum growing as we welcome new parishioners moving into our neighborhood, begin new efforts of evangelization and welcoming, and continue to offer topics of faith formation that bring us into closer discipleship with Jesus and relate to daily life. For all these developments and more, we have a duty to be grateful to God for these blessings; and it is important that we keep the momentum going.

As Fr. Hyacinth prepares to assume the responsibility of pastor for the parish, he and I have been discerning and discussing the nature of personnel support he needs to effectively serve the parish. The outcome of our deliberations is the creation a Pastoral Associate position. This person will be part of the team of pastor, parochial vicar, director of music, and business manager. The new position calls for leadership in certain areas of parish life and a strong supporting role for the effective management of daily duties and tasks. We have

reviewed over 60 applicants for the position. Fr. Hyacinth interviewed 6, made a final selection, offered the position, and received an acceptance of the offer. The new hire will begin on May 21.

A regrettable result of this development is that the current position of Administrative Assistant will be eliminated at the end of the day on May 18. Denise Marshall has worked in this position for 10 years and will be leaving employment by the parish. On behalf of the parish, I want to express my gratitude for her years of service and commitment. I know that she has endeared herself to many parishioners through her compassionate attention to needs large and small. We pray for God's blessings upon her and her family as she looks for employment that will utilize her gifts and talents to their full potential.


