Anointing of the Sick: Those facing serious illness or entering the hospital.

History: The figure on the Northwest corner of the altar is St. Hyacinth (1185-1257) with the ciborium and statue of Virgin Mary. The Virgin Mary helped St. Hyacinth save both the Eucharist and her heavy statue when the Tartars sacked Kiev. As Hyacinth fled the attack, he and the community that accompanied him escaped the Tartars by miraculously walking on the water. His feast day is celebrated on August 17. - Courtesy of Mary Moran

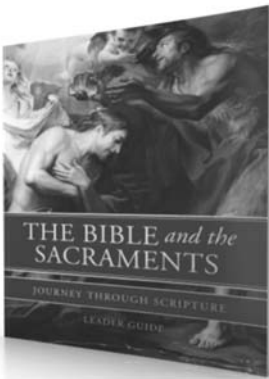
