



 - ◆ The label "SM" means the music is in the blue St Michael's Hymnal
 - ◆ The Gloria for all Masses is #164 in the St. Michael's Hymnal.
- Some of our community music is based on easy to remember responses and will not be listed on the hymn board. PLEASE SING!
- Out of solemn respect for the Mass, we follow the custom of remaining at our places within the church until the conclusion of the recessional hymn.
- Please silence your cell phone: As an overt act of courtesy (and respect for the prayer of all), please remember to silence/ turn off your cell phone when you arrive in the church.
