Last week Sunday, the Parish Pastoral Council met for the first time of my pastorate here at St. Dominic's. It was a positive and enthusiastic meeting. Two primary agenda items were, 1) an assessment of the parish currently; and 2) brainstorming on the revitalization/reinvigoration of parish life and mission.

The current assessment is that attendance at weekly Sunday Mass has greatly decreased. Here's a summary of the annual October headcount (the number is average attendance over all the Sundays of October): 2002: 644; 2007: 491; 2012: 386; 2017: 357; 2018: 365; 2019: 382; 2020: 195; 2021: 270; 2022: 302. The response to the recent pandemic means that many workers are working from home, there is a variety of personal comfort levels of being in public spaces, the St. Dominic Young Adults (SDYA) group no longer meets; the Cenacle group meets only virtually, and the special events such as Advent Stations, Passiontide, and chant Masses have not been offered for the last few years. Lower attendance has caused a decrease in financial support and the parish has a deficit budget. However, the quality of liturgical celebrations and preaching remains exceptional, the priests remain available for the sacramental and spiritual needs of parishioners, and the population in SW has greatly increased because of urban development, especially at The Wharf.

The council members believe, as do I, that there is a deep desire within the parish to revive parish life. Thoughts are to reintroduce the special events mentioned above, which usually attracted many people. We are not able to do everything all at once, but we can make a start and grow from there. We should look for ways that members of the community can serve the needs of the poor and marginalized. (Coats for Kids and the Giving Tree are 2 efforts.) We need to foster and encourage intergenerational friendships to build a stronger sense of community; and we must consider efforts of evangelization and reaching out to the new people who have moved into our neighborhood.

To build momentum for renewal in the parish, the council has agreed to meet more frequently than once a month. This willingness shows a beautiful generosity of time and talent for which I am grateful. All parishioners working together and participating in the offerings of the parish will revitalize this parish for us and for others.

Everyone's support is necessary. Please keep the parish in your prayers for the help of God's grace. Remember, Scripture says, "Unless the Lord builds the house, in vain do its builders labor" (Psalm 127:1).

## Poor Box Donations

For many years, the parish has had a virtual Poor Box to provide for those in need. Giving is made through Faith Direct or with cash/check specifically designated for this purpose. Let me say a hearty "thank you" for the generosity of those who have given and continue to give to the Poor Box. The purpose of the Poor Box is to help and serve those in need, not to create a large reserve. Oftentimes, we collaborate with other parishes through the facilitation of Catholic Charities so that an entire need can be met.

With this bulletin, the parish will begin providing a quarterly summary report of monies received and disbursed through the Poor Box. It is important that we all see how our parish community reaches out to the community and responds to those in need.

For the quarter (July-September) ending September 30:

- Receipts: \$11,689.88
- Disbursements:
  - ◆ Direct support to individual requests: \$200
  - ◆ Little Sisters of the Poor in Washington, DC: \$4,000
  - ◆ S.O.M.E.: \$2,000
  - ◆ St. Vincent de Paul Church Food Bank: \$1,500
  - ◆ Knights of Columbus Coats for Kids: \$1,000
  - ◆ Semper Fi and America's Fund: \$1,500

Please note that these disbursements greatly reduce the reserve that had accumulated because of a particularly large donation. May God bless all who serve the needs of the poor through this means of the parish.

### Coats for Kids




