Parish Renewal: The Kingly Dimension

This is the fourth of a series of four articles on parish renewal. Week 1 (July 10) covered parish renewal in general and explained envisioning the whole parish in terms of the priestly, prophetic, and kingly mission of Jesus. Week 2 (July 17) focused on the priestly dimension, Week 3 (July 24) on the prophetic dimension, and this week (Week 4) covers the kingly dimension. A king governs and serves. God called and blessed David, and his descendants after him, to govern and serve His people in the Old Testament, to be a “shepherd after His own heart” (1 Sam 13:14). Jesus fulfills and perfects this shepherding and serving role in the New Testament: He is the Good Shepherd who calls, leads, forms, nourishes, heals, and serves His people. He is preeminent in service: He seeks out the lost sheep, heals the sick, draws in the poor, washes the feet of His disciples, and lays down His life for His sheep.

Through baptism, we share in this kingly mission of Jesus. Jesus calls us, through His grace, to master our own wayward hearts, or order our lives to the kingdom of heaven, and to lead, guide, and serve others in charity and mercy. He calls us to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, shelter the homeless, visit the sick and imprisoned, and bury the dead (the *Corporal Works of Mercy*); and to counsel the doubtful, instruct the ignorant, admonish the sinner, comfort the sorrowful, forgive injuries, bear wrongs patiently, and pray for the living and the dead (the *Spiritual Works of Mercy*).

We are also called to live out this kingly mission of Jesus as a parish as well. The administration of the parish through the priests, staff, and parish and finance councils is a way of sharing in the *governing* dimension of the kingly mission. Our outreach to the needy is a way of sharing in the *service* dimension of this same kingly mission. And since a king brings his people together, the communal and social aspects of the parish (socials, picnics, spaghetti dinners, outings, etc.) are a way of sharing in the *social* aspects of the kingly mission. The *service* dimension involves many things. It involves service *within* the parish: liturgical ministries, the “Garden Angels,” the Church Cleaning Group, the Collection Counters, and the Hospitality Committee). Our *outward* service of charity includes local outreach to those in need (who come to us regularly), meals served to the homeless four times a year through S.O.M.E. (So Others Might Eat),

visiting and bringing Holy Communion to the sick and homebound, Coats for Kids, donating toys to needy children at Christmas, the Knitting Circle, Pro-life outreach through donations to the Capitol Hill Pregnancy Center, and the Society of St. Martin de Porres (a coordinating group for outreach). We are all called to serve within and from our parish, our spiritual home. Our goal is to involve more people in these ministries, and to expand our service with time. We thank all who are so generous in giving their time to serve within and from the parish, and we invite you all to think and pray about how you might serve. . . and so fulfill the kingly mission of Christ in your own life!
