Feast of St. Jude

We are blessed to have two shrines here at St. Dominic, the Shrine of Our Lady of the Rosary and the Shrine of St. Jude. Together we call them the "Rosary Shrine of St. Jude." For many years, people have sought prayers from Our Lady of the Rosary and St. Jude, and obtained spiritual favors. It was only fitting that we would renovate the Shrine of St. Jude to make the side chapel truly something special and more conducive to prayer. Fr. Schommer spearheaded the design and construction, and we are truly blessed with the result.

It is fitting that we would celebrate St. Jude in a special way each year. So, this is the first year, at least in recent times, where we intentionally celebrated a solemn Mass in the evening to honor this Apostle of Jesus. We also used the occasion to bless the newly renovated shrine.

The day was filled with blessings. Midday on Friday, October 28, the Feast of Sts. Simon and Jude, the staff, teachers, and children of Waterfront Academy, a Montessori school in the Catholic tradition in our Southwest quadrant, made a pilgrimage to the shrine, bringing colored pictures of St. Jude and flowers. They joined us for the 12:10pm Mass. Later on, our solemn evening Mass was well attended and beautifully celebrated. We even had a family come from Michigan to attend the Mass. They had received a miraculous cure for their daughter at her birth through St. Jude. They came to give thanks. Fr. Albert Trudel, OP, a priest from the Dominican House of Studies gave a powerful homily on St. Jude. He spoke about St. Jude in the Gospel of John, of the origin of St. Jude Hospital, of the iconography of St. Jude (the symbols associated with him in art), and of being devoted to this great saint of the "impossible." At the end of the Mass, we processed to the Shrine with the relic of St. Jude and blessed the shrine. Fr. Schommer gave the final blessing with the relic, and afterward I held the relic for all to venerate. The Knights of Columbus generously arranged for a nice reception.

As part of our parish renewal, we are trying to promote devotion to the saints of our shrines more. In August, we had an enrollment for the Confraternity of the Rosary. We are now promoting St. Jude more. It is timely! Many are rightly worried about our country in light of the upcoming elections. Is not St. Jude a most fitting saint to turn to in our situation? St. Jude, Apostle of Jesus, pray for us!

St. Faustina Kowalska was a humble nun in Poland, yet God used her to share the devotion to his Divine Mercy with the whole world. She gives each of us a powerful example of how to give our lives over to God, writing in her diary: "I want to be completely transformed into Your mercy and to be Your living reflection, O Lord. May the greatest of all divine attributes, that of Your unfathomable mercy, pass through my heart and soul to my neighbor." St. Faustina truly took to heart the words the Lord gave her for the Divine Mercy image: "Jesus, I trust in you."
