Dear Parishioners,

Some years ago, I became curious about environmental issues. Since then I have learned a lot. I have learned that these issues are real, serious, and urgent. The Church is called to take a leading role in good stewardship of the earth and its resources. Church teaching on the environment has developed since the beginning of the Industrial Revolution, culminating with a whole encyclical by Pope Francis last year on the environment, called Laudato Si'. In the Faith & Earth series we just began, we are exploring these issues in the light of faith. The first night went very well. Over 40 people came. After an initial overview and reflections, we watched a short film on the Catholic Church and ecology, and then our first documentary. After that, we ended with a very fruitful discussion. I hope that even more people will come in the future. The next night in the series is this Sunday, June 19, from 6:30-8:30pm in the parish hall. Refreshments will be provided. We will watch the second episode of Years of Living Dangerously. After that we will watch a shorter film on the acidification of the oceans. We always end with a discussion about the problems, signs of hope, and what we can do.

On another note, on behalf of the Dominican community, I would like to wish all of our fathers a most blessed Father's Day. We give thanks for, and pray for, all of our fathers, living and deceased. May the Father of all continue to bless and guide them, and make them holy in the image of His Fatherhood. God bless you all!
