"Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us now and at the hour of our death." We make this petition on the first day of the year recalling that God the Father chose Mary to be the mother of his divine Son. Because he is God, she is rightly called the Mother of

God in his humanity for he takes his flesh from her. We are reminded on this 8th day of Christmas that she is uniquely positioned to intercede for us and all our needs because of her closeness to Jesus. We do well to entrust our lives and prayers to her everyday.

As we begin the new calendar year, I am pleased to announce the selection of 3 new members to the parish pastoral council: Jay Hurst, Doris Stukes, and Susan Timoney. Each one brings an experience and perspective of the parish representative of the demographics of the parish. Their gifts, talents, and expertise will provide an important resource to me as pastor to help us all live as disciples of Jesus, grow as a parish, and implement programming that serves the needs of our parish and our neighbors. These new members join the current council members: Philip Clarke, Tim Lang, Maggie Smith, and Carrie Traverso. Thank you to those people who made nominations of parishioners for consideration. All were good candidates. Those not selected will be retained on a list for future consideration when the need arises.

Next Sunday we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord. In observance of this feast, chalk will be blessed and made available for the blessing of the home. In this blessing, prayer is made for good health and safety in the new year. Instructions will be provided.

Please consider participating in a new liturgical offering here at St. Dominic's – Solemn Vespers for the Feast of the Nativity of the Lord (Sunday, January 8 at 7:00 p.m.). Vespers is the evening prayer of the Liturgy of the Hours (Divine Office) that is prayed daily by priests, consecrated religious brothers and sisters, and many lay people. The whole Office is the prayer of the Church and fulfills Jesus' command to "pray always" (Luke 18:1; see also 1 Thessalonians 5:17). One of the fruits of the Second Vatican Council is a strong encouragement that all the faithful would join in this prayer as much as possible. In the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy we read, "Pastors of souls should see to it that the principal hours, especially Vespers, are celebrated in common in church on Sundays and on the more solemn feasts. And the laity, too, are

encouraged to recite the divine office, either with the priests, or among themselves, or even individually" (SC art. 100).

Solemn vespers is a non-sacramental celebration of liturgical prayer. Anyone and everyone is welcome to the church to participate in the singing of the Psalms, listening to a brief Scriptural reading, and making prayers of intercession for the needs of the world. The celebration is an "easy" ecumenical offering of praise and worship of God. Inviting family members, friends, and neighbors is most appropriate. A printed program will be provided. Trained musicians and singers will provide leadership and talent. The entire service lasts 25-30 minutes.
