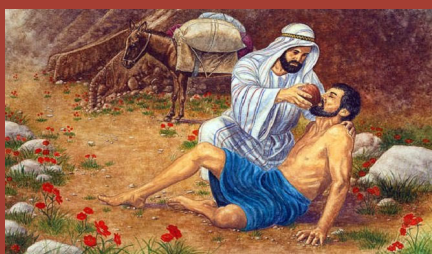

SANCTUARY CANDLE

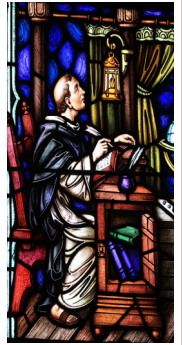

PARISH COOKOUT

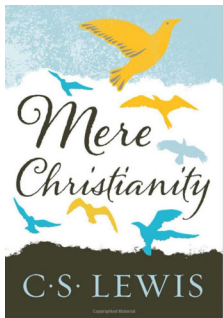


Join us **after the 10:30 Mass** for a parish cookout on the side lawn of the church and priory. The church will provide hamburgers, hotdogs and beverages.

WORSHIP

Singing at Mass: Hymns, Prayers and Responses:

- Our community's sung and spoken responses during the ritual prayers of the liturgy are a key parts of communal prayer.
- At all weekend Masses, the Hymns are listed on the boards near the front of the church.
 - ♦ The label "BB" means the music is in the Breaking Bread Book
 - ♦ The label "SM" means the music is in the blue St Michael's Hymnal
 - ♦ The label "Mass" provides you the location of the sung Mass parts (Gloria, Sanctus, etc.).
- Some of our community music is based on easy to remember responses and will not be listed on the hymn board. PLEASE SING ANYWAY!
- Out of solemn respect for the Mass, we follow the custom of remaining at our places within the church until the conclusion of the recessional hymn.
- *Please silence your cell phone:* As an overt act of courtesy (and respect for the prayer of all), please remember to silence/ turn off your cell phone when you arrive in the church.
