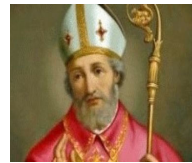
CHURCH HISTORY



The 4th double window on the north side of the church features Blessed Paul, Founder of the Hungarian Province (d. 1241). He was sent to lead Dominican missionaries into Hungary, Poland, Albania, Russia, and Mongolia. Blessed Paul founded the monastery for women in Veszprém, laying the cornerstone himself. St. Margaret of Hungary (featured in the 3rd double window on the south of the church) studied under the nuns at Veszprém.

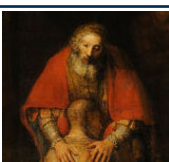

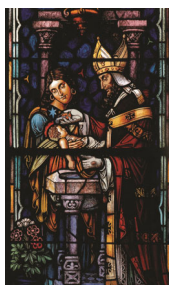

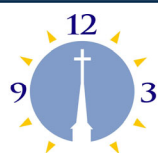
Baptism: "Parents are obliged to take care that infants are baptized in the first few weeks" (*Code of Canon Law, 867§1*).
