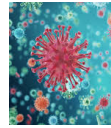
SANCTUARY CANDLE

COVID-19 UPDATE



The Archdiocese of Washington has notified DC Catholic churches of the Mayor's reinstatement of a universal, indoor masking mandate for everyone. It reads:

"Mayor Bowser re-instituted a universal, indoor masking mandate for everyone, even those fully vaccinated, which took effect on July 31 at 5:00 a.m. The DC Health Department guidance implementing this mandate allows a person to remove their mask in their own office or when addressing an audience, provided the speaker (or singer) can maintain 6-feet of distance from the audience."

The Archdiocese additionally states that "Pastors in those jurisdictions that require masking may, in their discretion, allow clergy, lectors, and cantors to remove their mask temporarily, consistent with local guidance, during religious services at their parishes."

There are currently no restrictions on capacity.

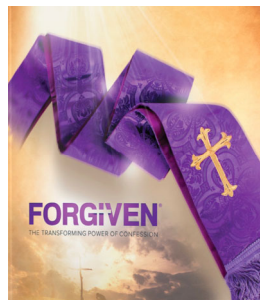

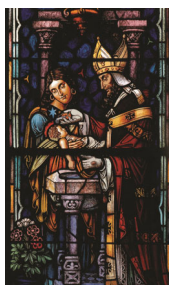

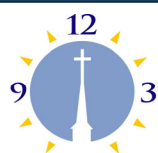
Baptism: "Parents are obliged to take care that infants are baptized in the first few weeks" (*Code of Canon Law, 867§1*).
