CHURCH HISTORY

The figure on the Southeast corner of the Altar of Sacrifice represents St. Pius V (1504-72). He wears the Papal Tiara and is holding a cross and rosary. Pius V is known as the “Pope of the Rosary” because he declared October 7th the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary to honor Our Lady’s intercession in the miraculous victory of the Christian fleet over the Turks in the battle of Lepanto on October 7, 1571.

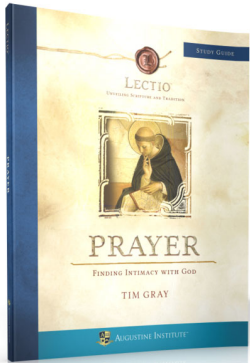

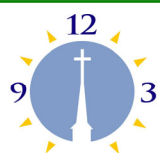
Baptism: "Parents are obliged to take care that infants are baptized in the first few weeks" (*Code of Canon Law, 867§1*).
