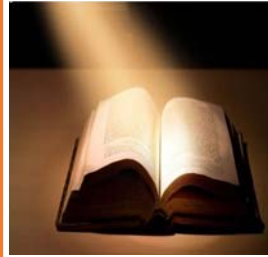
SANCTUARY CANDLE

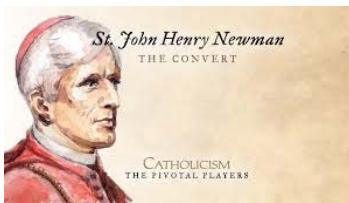
