Stay Tuned: Parish Renewal Underway!

Jesus called us, His followers, to be the "light of the world" (Mt 5:14). We at St. Dominic's are called to be the light of Christ for Southwest Washington, DC and beyond. For us to be the light of the world, we have to both be renewed within and to radiate Christ's light outward. As a parish, and during this Year of Mercy and the 800th Anniversary of the Order of Preachers (the "Dominicans"), we are trying with God's guidance to lay the foundations of renewal within our parish, so that we can better attract people to Christ and His Church, and "make disciples" of those who come to us. This will also be important, in light of the development that is happening in our neighborhood. Of course, people have mixed feelings about it. However, we are called to make the best out of the situation and seize the opportunity to draw people to Christ, His Church, and our parish.

Our parish council has been "spiritually envisioning" our parish, seeing all things in light of our mission to be the light of the world in our own area. We have been envisioning everything that our parish does in terms of the threefold mission of Christ: the priestly mission of Christ (the liturgy and sacraments), the prophetic mission of Christ (evangelizing, teaching, and forming), and the kingly mission of Christ (shepherding and serving). It is fellowship, or "communion" in Christ that unifies all of these elements. "Mission" flows from "Communion." "Mission" also flows back to and enriches "Communion." All this is reflected in our new mission statement, which you can find on the front of this bulletin. And, more and more, everything we do as a parish will reflect this new vision. Vision governs action. Vision shapes action. Vision directs and motivates action.

What new things will we see ahead in this work of renewal, and in this new vision? Lots! We'll be explaining more in the bulletin articles ahead. We will also be explaining and involving you in this new vision through Sunday homilies and listening sessions after Mass, all in the months ahead. Stay tuned!

JUBILEE REFLECTION— FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



"We also know in faith that Jesus seeks us out. He wants to heal our wounds, to soothe our feet which hurt from travelling alone, to wash each of us clean of the dust from our journey. He doesn't ask us where we have been, he doesn't question us about what we have done. Rather, he tells us: 'Unless I wash your feet, you have no share with me' (Jn 13:8). Unless I wash your feet, I will not be able to give you the life which the Father always dreamed of, the life for which he created you. ... Life means 'getting our feet dirty' from the dust-filled roads of life and history. All of us need to be cleansed, to be washed. All of us. Myself, first and foremost. All of us are being sought out by the Teacher, who wants to help us resume our journey. The Lord goes in search of us; to all of us he stretches out a helping hand."
