St. Dominic Roman Catholic Church



Last week Thursday, Friday, and the weekend brought many visitors to our city and the parish for the National March for Life. The parish was host to more than a dozen groups of various sizes bringing more

than 3,000 people into our pews. Many remarked on the beauty and prayerfulness of our church and expressed their gratitude for the hospitality extended to them. Donations made by these groups defrayed the expenses incurred and we are grateful to them for doing so. A good relationship has been established with many of the groups who will be repeat visitors in future years.

This weekend, we join the Dominican friars and hundreds of people associated with them to begin the ninemonth novena in preparation for the Dominican Rosary Pilgrimage to be celebrated on Saturday, September 30, 2023. The pilgrimage is a full-day event celebrating the Rosary at the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception here in Washington, DC on the Vigil of Rosary Sunday. This event will include conferences on the Rosary preached by the friars, several hours of Eucharistic Adoration and Confessions, and a recitation of the Rosary and Mass in the Upper Church.

The pilgrimage begins (spiritually) with a 9-month novena prayed on the 30th day of every month, starting January 30, 2023. As a parish, we will print the novena prayer in the bulletin closest to the 30th of the month (28th in February) so that everyone will be reminded and will have the prayer at hand. The prayer will be distributed in the weekly Flocknote as well. Printed prayer cards are available in the pamphlet racks of the church. We have 1,000 of these prayer cards, so feel free to take prayer cards home, give them to friends and loved ones, and invite others to join in the 9-month novena. All ministries of the Province of St. Joseph, Rosary Confraternities, Dominican sisters, and Dominican Laity are encouraged to participate in the Rosary Pilgrimage and promote it to others. A reminder that Catholics may request the celebration of Holy Mass for the benefit of the living and deceased. Practically any good and holy request can be made an object of a Mass request such as for a deceased family member or friend, birthday, healing of sickness, blessings in marriage, the conversion of sinners, etc. The parish has many openings in the Mass Intention calendar. Additionally, Masses may be requested to be celebrated by the Dominican priests at an unannounced time, but always within one year. Requests for Masses are made through the parish office. An offering of \$10 for each Mass is requested.
