FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



As we continue our celebration of the Lord's Resurrection, we call to mind today that his victory over sin and death leads us into eternal life. As we put our faith in him and live in the grace of the Holy Spirit, he will shepherd our souls in the way of virtue

and holiness. St. Peter teaches us today that "he himself bore our sins in his body upon the cross, so that, free from sin, we might live for righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed."

It is imperative for each of us to listen to the voice of the Lord each day. His word comes to us in our daily prayer, in the Scriptures that we read and the sacraments we receive. Jesus continually provides us with wisdom and guidance for our behavior and our response to the challenges and difficulties in life. For all who listen to him, he will provide an abundance of grace. In him we find fulfillment; in him we find rest. Let us ask the Lord to open our ears so that we may hear his voice and to empower us to follow him wherever he leads. Why? Because he came so that we may have life and have it more abundantly.

The life of our parish continues to grow and develop. I am looking forward to the Meet & Greet with the Parish Pastoral Council today following the 10:30 Mass. This will be an opportunity for me to provide some information on the status of the parish, listen to input from parishioners, and strengthen the bonds of fellowship between the council members and parishioners. The greater our collaboration with one another to work on different initiatives of worship and service, the more we become a witness to the working of God's love and grace in our lives. Someone recently commented to me that he likes being a parishioner at St. Dominic's because of the diversity of age, race, culture, and economic position. All members of our congregation are a gift to the community. As St. Paul says in the Letter to the Galatians, "all are one in Christ Jesus." Each person is invited to share gifts, talents, time, and resources. There are many ways to volunteer: liturgical ministries, singers, hospitality, gardeners, church cleaners, and service to the poor. Doing works together unites us in the Lord.

This week we are expecting delivery of the tuba rank of pipes for the Roosevelt Organ. Installation will follow. The painting of the pipe chest is partially complete, and we hope to finish that work soon. The console where the organist sits and plays should be delivered by the end of June.

At this time, we are on schedule for all the work to be completed in time for the rededication blessing and concert on October 27 at 7:00 p.m.

Demolition of the wall that covered the wood arches on the face of the organ loft will continue until complete. Afterward, I will be consulting with an architect and a restoration company to determine the final desired outcome. Because of needed repairs and painting, it will look like an unfinished project for a while; but, we can all look with amazement at something beautiful.

Thank you to all who made donations for the Easter flowers. They were beautiful and we kept them watered to make them last as long as possible. Some have been given away to be planted in a home garden.

Capitol Hill Pregnancy Center




