FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



As we continue to live in the grace and joy of the Resurrection, the liturgical readings from the Acts of the Apostles direct our attention to the spread of the Faith and the growth of the Church. Time and again we hear and read that the Holy Spirit was

guiding the Apostles and early believers through challenges that arose in the community. Through prayer and discernment, the life and structures of the Church began to develop.

The first reading for this Fifth Sunday of Easter is one example. It seems that the ministry of the Apostles was not able to reach everyone in the community. People began to complain that there was neglect. As the community worked toward a solution, a distinction in ministry was made. The Apostles would devote themselves to prayer and the ministry of the Word; whereas, others (who would later be identified as deacons) would assume the responsibility of distributing food and material goods within the community.

Much growth and development has happened over the last 2,000 years. We see a wide variety of ministry and service within the Church. Each of us, in virtue of our Baptism, has a place in the community. In our own parish community, there are a variety of opportunities for liturgical ministries and non -liturgical service to meet the needs of others. As your pastor, I am keenly aware that I cannot meet all the needs of each person. Human limitations and the priority of celebrating the liturgy, preaching homilies, providing faith formation, and bringing the sacraments to the Church mean that there are other works that I cannot do. Addressing this reality, the Decree on the Apostolate of the Laity of the Second Vatican Council states: "In the Church there is a diversity of ministry but a oneness of mission. Christ conferred on the Apostles and their successors the duty of teaching, sanctifying, and ruling in His name and power. But the laity likewise share in the priestly, prophetic, and royal office of Christ and therefore have their own share in the mission of the whole people of God in the Church and in the world. They exercise the apostolate in fact by their activity directed to the evangelization and sanctification of men and to the penetrating and perfecting of the temporal order through the spirit of the Gospel. In this way, their temporal activity openly bears witness to Christ and promotes the salvation of men. Since the laity, in accordance with their

state of life, live in the midst of the world and its concerns, they are called by God to exercise their apostolate in the world like leaven, with the ardor of the spirit of Christ" (2).

Our parish is small, but we are called by the Lord to great things because we live, move, and find our being in the Holy Spirit. Greater involvement from every parishioner in the life and mission of the parish makes it possible and easier to spread the kingdom of Christ and to enable every person to share in his saving redemption. We are looking to develop family faith programs to meet the needs of children; to revive our RCIA with sponsors to accompany those who are coming to Christ and his Church; to enhance our adult faith formation offerings that need facilitators; to bring ever greater beauty to the celebration of the liturgy, which needs volunteers; and to establish evangelization teams to reach out to our neighbors who do not know Jesus, or have a church to call home.

Please prayerfully consider how you can participate more fully in the parish with time, talent, and treasure. The needs are great, but greater involvement by everyone will make the commitment manageable for everyone.

This weekend is the last weekend of Brother Dominic's service to the parish as a deacon. He will be leaving on Friday for retreat in preparation for his ordination to the priesthood. His ordination will be on Saturday, May 20 at 9:30 a.m. at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception. All are welcome. On Sunday, May 21 at 10:30 a.m., the newly-ordained Father Dominic will celebrate a Mass of Thanksgiving with our parish community. Please consider attending the Mass of Ordination and/or the Mass of Thanksgiving. These are beautiful, grace-filled moments in the living history of our parish and the Church.

Let us love one another and pray for each other,


