"No pain, no gain." This phrase is often used within the realm of sport training wherein athletes are pushed to their physical limits to advance their strength and skill. In essence, it is a phrase of encouragement so that the athlete will make an internal choice

to embrace the pain to gain the benefits. In light of our Christian faith in Jesus, we look at his life and can alter the phrase to say "no death, no glory."

The event of the Transfiguration of the Lord highlights the saving work of redemption: the Passion and Death of Jesus leads to the glory of the Resurrection. This is the paradigm of the Christian life. Jesus teaches us this truth when he says: "If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will save it" (Lk 9:23-24).

Jesus invites us into glory with him and goes ahead of us to show us the way – the way of the Cross. Just as Jesus entered willingly into his Passion, so we are invited to make the internal choice to enter willingly into the disciplines and sufferings of the Christian life. The penances that we embrace; the time that we spend in prayer; and the charity that we show to our neighbor are all ways that we die to our pride, our sin, and our selfish motivations. This way of suffering and mortification leads to the healing of our sick souls and our strength in virtue and holiness.

The Transfiguration of the Lord invites us to listen to the beloved Son of the Father who teaches us, shows us, and walks with us on the road through death to glory. When we, like the apostles on the mountain, behold the glory of the Lord, we can find the strength to make the internal choice to follow him so that we may always desire and at last attain the glory revealed to us in Christ.

I invite you to look at our local newspaper – *The Southwester*. The August issue has an advertisement and invitation to our neighborhood community to consider "Becoming Catholic" through the RCIA program that begins in September. Please consider using this ad or the parish flier (Becoming Catholic at the doors of the church) as a help to your own personal invitation to those who may be considering becoming a Catholic or to those who are interested in learning more about the Catholic faith. The primary reason why people have considered becoming a Catholic is that someone extended a personal invitation. This invitation can and should be extended to spouses, siblings, relatives, friends, and neighbors. Together, we can all be involved in welcoming people to our parish and to a personal relationship with Jesus Christ in the midst of the Church.

This week Tuesday, we celebrate the feast of Our Holy Father St. Dominic, the patron of our parish. To honor St. Dominic is to glorify God because we acknowledge that God's grace has produced a man of virtue and holiness. His life is another shining example that God's grace brings beauty and perfection to our human nature. We look to St. Dominic and ask him to intercede for each of us that we, too, may receive the grace of God to be a person of virtue, holiness, and perfection. Over a decade ago, Pope Benedict XVI spoke about St. Dominic in one of his Wednesday audiences. In the address, he said: "This great Saint reminds us that in the heart of the Church a missionary fire must always burn. It must be a constant incentive to make the first proclamation of the Gospel and, wherever necessary, a new evangelization. Christ, in fact, is the most precious good that the men and women of every time and every place have the right to know and love!" (February 3, 2010) In light of these words, we do well to ask St. Dominic to make our parish and each of us an instrument of a new evangelization. Since men and women have a right to know and love Jesus Christ, it is a matter of justice that we give witness to the living Lord and invite those men and women to put their faith in Him. St. Dominic Parish is the only Catholic Church in Southwest Washington. May St. Dominic obtain for us the graces we need to invite people to encounter the Lord Jesus in our Catholic Church. We will celebrate his feast with a solemn, sung Mass at 7 p.m. on Tuesday, August 8.

On the last page of this bulletin, you will find an announcement from Nathan Ringkamp that he is resigning as organist from St. Dominic's. We will bid him farewell next Sunday, August 13 at the coffee and donuts gathering after the 10:30 Mass.

Rest assured that we are in the search process for a new organist, and we will continue to have music at Mass during that time. Please pray for the right person to fill the position.



From the Catechism of the Catholic Church. A weekly, continuous reading of the Article on the Sacrament of the Eucharist:

#### "Do this in memory of me"

1341 The command of Jesus to repeat his actions and words "until he comes" does not only ask us to remember Jesus and what he did. It is directed at the liturgical celebration, by the apostles and their successors, of the memorial of Christ, of his life, of his death, of his Resurrection, and of his intercession in the presence of the Father. [165]

1342 From the beginning the Church has been faithful to the Lord's command. Of the Church of Jerusalem it is written:

> They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.... Day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they partook of food with glad and generous hearts. [166]

1343 It was above all on "the first day of the week," Sunday, the day of Jesus' resurrection, that the Christians met "to break bread." [167] From that time on down to our own day the celebration of the Eucharist has been continued so that today we encounter it everywhere in the Church with the same fundamental structure. It remains the center of the Church's life.

1344 Thus from celebration to celebration, as they proclaim the Paschal mystery of Jesus "until he comes," the pilgrim People of God advances, "following the narrow way of the cross,"[168] toward the heavenly banquet, when all the elect will be seated at the table of the kingdom.

I appreciate any prayers you can spare for me as I enter this exciting chapter of my life. Please know of my prayers for each of you and the parish.


