FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Late last Spring, I learned that no Dominican deacon or student brother from the Dominican House of Studies will be assigned to the parish this academic year. No reason was given, but I am guessing it is because recent class sizes have been smaller. But God

provides! We have a student intern from The Catholic University of America who will be working in the parish this academic year. An introduction to Maggie Friedmann is found below. Please extend a warm welcome when you see her. Her hours and duties are to be determined.

We received disappointing news last week that the restoration of the Roosevelt organ will not be completed in time for the scheduled blessing and rededication concert in October. We are waiting for the fabrication of a new console that houses the keyboards and draw knobs used by the organist. The subcontractor used by the organ builder has been unable to meet numerous deadlines which they themselves provided. The organ builder has decided to seek an alternative subcontractor who is interested in the project. We are awaiting finalization of a commitment. In the meantime, the organ builder has committed to completing all other contracted work by the end of October 2023 so that the console installation will be the only remaining work. A date for the rededication concert will be set after the installation of the console. The need for patience in this circumstance is necessary because the work is highly specialized and there are very few qualified people or companies engaged in this artistic work. We will continue to have regular meetings with the organ builder to keep abreast of developments and to encourage completion.

It's not too late to register or invite someone for the program of Becoming Catholic. We currently have 5 registrants and will begin our formation gatherings on Saturday, September 9. The regular meetings will be on Saturday mornings. Please complete a registration form available on the website, in the pamphlet racks in the church, or call the parish office.

The neighborhood cenacles are still open for registration. A start date has not been set with the hope that more people will register. Please consider doing so this week. The topics will focus upon the Eucharist as our country engages in a time of Eucharistic Revival.

The annual parish financial report for parishioners is now available. Thanks to the generosity of parishioners, friends of the parish, and visitors, we overcame the budget deficit and paid all our obligations. Providing the report is a requirement of the Archdiocese of Washington so that there will be transparency in the parish. The report along with monthly financial statements are reviewed by the parish Finance Council. They provide advice and counsel to the pastor, and I am grateful for their service and support. From the Catechism of the Catholic Church. A weekly, continuous reading of the Article on the Sacrament of the Eucharist:

The movement of the celebration

1348 All gather together. Christians come together in one place for the Eucharistic assembly. At its head is Christ himself, the principal agent of the Eucharist. He is high priest of the New Covenant; it is he himself who presides invisibly over every Eucharistic celebration. It is in representing him that the bishop or priest acting in the person of Christ the head (in persona Christi capitis) presides over the assembly, speaks after the readings, receives the offerings, and says the Eucharistic Prayer. All have their own active parts to play in the celebration, each in his own way: readers, those who bring up the offerings, those who give communion, and the whole people whose "Amen" manifests their participation.

1349 The Liturgy of the Word includes "the writings of the prophets," that is, the Old Testament, and "the memoirs of the apostles" (their letters and the Gospels). After the homily, which is an exhortation to accept this Word as what it truly is, the Word of God, and to put it into practice, come the intercessions for all men, according to the Apostle's words: "I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all men, for kings, and all who are in high positions."
