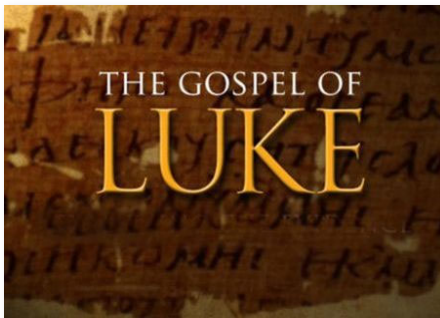

A FEW WORDS FROM FR. HYACINTH

We have a new parish council. We're trying a new model. Why? We felt the need to reduce the number of persons on the council, so that we could more easily meet. There was also a desire to fashion the council—with its structure and purpose—according to the mission of the parish. How? You might remember our *Priest Prophet King* schema. To recap, God worked through 3 main roles in the Old Testament to sanctify His people, through priests, prophets, and kings. When Christ came, He fulfilled all three roles. Thus, He is the perfect priest, prophet, and king in His own Person. When we are baptized into Christ, we are baptized into this threefold mission. We all are called to share in this threefold mission in our own unique way. Also, all activities of a parish can also be categorized under this threefold mission. Thus, all the sacraments and sacramentals fall under the priestly mission. All evangelization, faith formation, and discipleship groups fall under the prophetic mission. Administration, works of charity, and social activities fall under the kingly mission. This schema highlights how every activity in the parish is meaningful and shares in the mission of Christ in some way. It also helps to grasp the whole and how everything fits into it.

In our new parish council, one person, Deborah Irwin, is designated to oversee the priestly ministries. Two persons are designated for the prophetic mission, Chris Nodes over evangelization and RCIA, and Amelia Castro-Mendoza over faith formation and discipleship groups in the parish. And there are "Three Kings": Simon Ciccarillo overseeing the administrative dimensions, Maria Eugenia Lane the works of mercy, and Margaret MacLeod the social activities.

We want the parish council to be more visible and communicative to you and to all the parish ministries. I know there will be a lot of good fruits that will spring from this new council and model. I'm excited for this opportunity to try something new. And I ask for your prayers, that this might be yet another improvement in the parish that will allow God's grace to flourish more fully in use.

TODAY'S READINGS

AN ONGOING MISSION

In his hometown synagogue, Jesus' neighbors are amazed by his words. Surely the people know who he is. The carpenter's son. The young man who had learned in this very synagogue. The boy down the street.

Conflict arises as Jesus begins to define himself in a new way. When he compares himself to the ancient prophets Elijah and Elisha, the tensions grow. The tensions multiply when Jesus begins to tell of a new mission for God's people: the good news of the scriptures is intended for all.

In his famous passage from the First Letter to the Corinthians, St. Paul reminds us of the eternal nature of love. In today's readings, we are reminded that, like love, Jesus' mission cannot be contained. Jesus slips through the crowd of persecutors and moves on to new challenges. We are called to this same perseverance in the name of love.

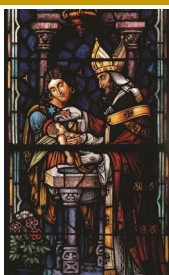

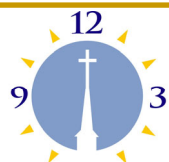
Please Contact the Parish Office
