



Each week, a different member leads the group and we pray for their petition and national or world intercession.


No rosary necessary. We will provide you with a Scriptural Rosary booklet to use. We look forward to your joining us.

Church History



On March 3, 1887, President Cleveland signed a bill that exempted St. Dominic's Church from "all taxes and assessments of any kind whatsoever heretofore at any time." This was in response to a U.S. Supreme

Court ruling, Gibbons v. the District of Columbia, which found that the city could tax church property. It wasn't until the birth of income tax in 1913 that churches became generally exempt from taxation.

- At the masses supported by our Ensemble, we will be singing the Mass of Creation found in the softcover Breaking Bread Book (starting with #885).

Out of solemn respect for the Mass, we follow the custom of remaining at our places within the church until the conclusion of the Recessional Hymn.

Mass Today — February 27, 2022 — Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

"A good tree does not bear rotten fruit." Because "every disciple will be like his teacher," our union with Jesus is what makes us good trees—we have his "store of goodness" within our hearts. On any given day, the good fruit that "shows the care we have had" might simply be our soul's humble, incessant attachment to Jesus' mercy. We need never give in to discouragement because of our weaknesses; if we turn to Jesus, "labor is not in vain." His perfect, sinless vision means he can remove the beams from our eyes with unfailing precision, "clothing us with immortality."

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke -6:39-45

Jesus told his disciples a parable, "Can a blind person guide a blind person? Will not both fall into a pit? No disciple is superior to the teacher; but when fully trained, every disciple will be like his teacher. Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye, but do not perceive the wooden beam in your own? How can you say to your brother, 'Brother, let me remove that splinter in your eye,' when you do not even notice the wooden beam in your own eye? You hypocrite! Remove the wooden beam from your eye firt; then you will see clearly to remove the splinter in your brother's eye.

"A good tree does not bear rotten fruit, nor does a rotten tree bear good fruit. For every tree is known by its own fruit. For people do not pick figs from the thornbushes, nor do they gather grapes from brambles. A good person out of the store of goodness in his heart produces good, but an evil person out of a store of evil produces evil; for rom the fullness of the heart the mouth speaks."

THE DOMINICAN FRIARS AT St. DOMINIC PRIORY

DID YOU KNOW? There are 27 Dominican Friars living here at St. Dominic's Priory (the building attached to the Church): 1 Prior/Pastor, 4 Retired priests, 1 priest on parish staff, 3 professors, 1 Mission Preacher, 1 Special Ministries priest, 1 Student Master (in charge of the Deacons)/Professor, 1 Supply Work Priest, 1 Procurator (Priest responsible for procuring goods), 1 Cooperator Brother (who helps out in the parish), 4 Newly Ordained, and 8 Deacons (who God willing will be ordained to the priesthood in May 2022).

We have a multi-generational house and we fund our house through our work as professors, Mission preaching, outside ministries and parish salaries (at this point, 1.5 salaries for 2 people). So things can be tight and your generosity to the Parish has been and continues to be wonderful. I would simply ask that you remember the priory and the Friars in your giving and remember us in your estate planning. The Dominican Friars have been serving the community and the Parish of St. Dominic's since 1852. Please don't forget about us when making your final arrangements.
