





PASTORAL CORNER

I am M J Morrow, a member of the St. Dominic Finance Council and a Lector. On the weekend of November 17th and 18th, you will receive a flyer encouraging you to participate in the financial stewardship of our Parish. It also contains the highlights of the financial report for our last fiscal year. We are blessed that St. Dominic has been fiscally prudent and that the many enhancements to our beautiful and historic Church have only been done when the funds have been available. We want to maintain that policy and also have sufficient funds to enhance our evangelization and charitable efforts.

The Parish will thrive if we each take our responsibilities to contribute our time, talent and treasure seriously. The more involved you are with Parish activities, the more invested you will feel in its success.

Our focus this month is on treasure. Most of us are familiar with the concept of tithing – pledging to give 10% to charity. While this may be a struggle for many, please try to think in terms of a percentage that you will give to all charitable causes and give your Parish half of what you can give. The Parish is your spiritual home and provides the physical place of worship. When you give to St. Dominic you are investing in the spiritual wellbeing of our community.

I have been a Parishioner for about six years and I am continually struck by the beauty of our liturgies, the quality of the preaching and our great Church. Standing in the back of the Church on Christmas Eve last year, waiting to process carrying the Gospel Book, hearing the organ and seeing the incredible beauty of the Church was an experience that touched my soul. I need this sense of community and belonging in our current chaotic world. I hope that belonging to and supporting St. Dominic Parish will also be a source of comfort and joy to you.

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — The widow of Zarephath had only a handful of flour and a little oil, but made a little cake for Elijah (1 Kings 17:10-16).

Psalm — Praise the Lord, my soul! (Psalm 146).

Second Reading — Christ will appear a second time to bring salvation to those who eagerly await him (Hebrews 9:24-28).

Gospel — This poor widow put in more than all the other contributors (Mark 12:38-44).

THE CALL TO DISCIPLESHIP

The core vocation in the Gospel of Mark is the vocation, or call, to discipleship. Today's Gospel passage provides us with one last example of what the vocation to discipleship means, and one example of what it doesn't mean. A destitute widow shows us that discipleship means following Jesus' way of service, even if it requires giving one's livelihood (or life). The scribes show us by their bad example that discipleship should entail a vocation to extend God's care to those who are most in need.

In our reading from the book of Kings another widow and her son are close to death. They too give what little they have, but they are rewarded by Elijah with food enough for a year. And the reading from the Letter to the Hebrews reminds us that Jesus sacrificed his life "to bring salvation to those who eagerly await him" (Hebrews 9:28).

- At the masses supported by our Ensemble, we are singing the Gloria found on page 2 of the insert attached to the front cover of the tan Breaking Bread Book, and the Mass of Creation responses (found in the Breaking Bread Book— #879-882)


