




Pastor's Corner



Welcome to Lent! In the Gospel reading today, Jesus demonstrates for us how to take full responsibility for the desires of our will and the choices we make. Sharing in our humanity, Jesus

was tempted and put to the test just like the rest of humanity. He was not exempt from this dimension of our human nature. Jesus demonstrates that right reason and obedience to the commandments of God empower us to be victorious over the most powerful of temptations. He shows us that the discernment of whether something is truly good always has reference to norms that are not self-determined. Rather, the norms are communicated to us through the good use of our intellect and through the inspired word of God.

Lent is a sacred time in the life of the Church for the renewing and purifying of our minds and hearts. Through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, we have the opportunity to cooperate with God's grace to master our sinfulness and conquer our pride. Through these disciplines we learn more clearly and powerfully how to discern the movements of our desires and passions: do they conform to God's will and truth or not? Hence, there is much to learn about ourselves and the truth that God has communicated to us through his Son. The process is arduous, but the Lord provides every grace we need to accomplish whatever he calls us to do. We can be confident that Christ is with us in our temptations and weakness. He inspires us and strengthens us to say "no" to Satan, to slavery, and to enmity with God; and "yes" to God, to freedom, and to peace.

Take the time to be still and listen to the voice of the Lord. As the Psalmist says today, "He guides the humble to justice, and he teaches the humble his way."
