


Pastor's Corner



Today, we celebrate the Ascension of the Lord into heaven. This "departure" of the Lord fills us with hope because Jesus brings our humanity into union with God and shows us the goal of our faith and Christian discipleship. We were created

and redeemed for heaven. Thus, St. Paul exhorts us: "If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is our life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory" (Col 3:1-3). This feast can be an occasion of personal assessment: am I seeking the life of heaven (a life of virtue and holiness); or am I distracted or consumed with all that is earthly and will pass away? Friendship with Jesus invites us to live in the world, but not in a worldly sort of way. He invites us to follow him each day in the grace of the Holy Spirit so that on the day of our death we can follow him into heaven.

Most years, for over a century, the Parish of St. Dominic has hosted the Mass of Ordination to the Priesthood for the Dominican Friars of the Province of St. Joseph. However, recent classes of those to be ordained have been larger, which means also a larger number of priests and guests attending the ordination Mass. There was a need for more space and more restrooms. Consequently, the Dominican Friars have determined that, for the foreseeable future, the Mass of Ordination will be scheduled at The Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception. This year, the date is Saturday May 19 at 9:30 a.m. At this Mass, 9 Dominican Friars will be ordained. The Ordination Mass is a beautiful ceremony and worth witnessing at least once in a lifetime. Everyone is invited to attend. (Please note: the 9:00 a.m. Mass on Saturday morning is canceled so that the priests may attend the Ordination Mass.)

On Sunday May 20 at the 10:30 a.m. Mass, Fr. Isaac Morales, O.P. (ordained the day before) will celebrate his Mass of Thanksgiving with the parish. Everyone is invited and encouraged to attend this Mass to give thanks to God for his priestly vocation and to wish him well as he moves into a new assignment. His presence will make our celebration of Pentecost all the more joyful as the Holy Spirit sends him forth to proclaim the Gospel.

During this week, Fr. Hyacinth will move into the pastor's office as we continue the transition of

leadership for the parish. His presence in the parish office area will allow him to learn more of the daily duties and responsibilities of a pastor; and enable him to oversee the welcome and training of the new pastoral associate who will begin on Monday May 21. I will be packing my personal items and continue to work from my room in the priory. A reminder that my Mass of farewell is on Sunday June 3 at 10:30 a.m., followed by a "block party" on the parish lawn. All are welcome.
