PASTORAL CORNER

Knights of Columbus, Fellow Parishioners, and St. Dominic's Commit to Saving Lives



Just over a year ago, the Knights of Columbus Patrick Cardinal O'Boyle Council 11302 (based in St. Dominic's), had a bold vision to provide an ultrasound for our local pregnancy center, the Capitol Hill Pregnancy Center (CHPC). Studies show that pregnancy centers with an ultrasound are able to save two to four children a week. The Knights of Columbus has an international effort to assist pregnancy centers with obtaining these life-saving machines: The local Knights fundraise for half of the funds and the Knights headquarters will donate the other half. Though this matching fund program has been in existence for years, Washington, D.C., was the only part of the country which had not participated, and both of D.C.'s pro-life pregnancy centers lacked a machine.

Grand Knight Jack Heretik and Past Grand Knight and Program Director Patrick Abbott met with CHPC and agreed to raise a \$29,500 for a 4D, portable ultrasound. Father Schommer ensured the first donation to the effort came from St. Dominic's Church. Because of the support of Knights of Columbus and people across the region, the necessary funds were raised in 90 days. In the next several months over \$25,000 were donated and the Knights' headquarters donated the matching \$14,500, allowing extra money to be spent on necessary equipment for the machine.

The fundraising's momentum fed upon itself. "Once you tell people what this is, what it's for, they will open their hearts and their wallets. There are so many people around here that want to help out with such a project. They have the same beliefs as us, they want to save these children," Jack said.

This undertaking was a community effort and we thank St. Dominic's, who provided the first donation. Father Hyacinth, Father Beade, and area champions of the CHPC were in attendance for Bishop Mario Dorsonville's blessing of the ultrasound on June 27. The Bishop prayed that the machine would help start a cycle of caring for life from conception to old age

The CHPC and the Knights thanked one other and pledged to cooperate in the future, deepening the opportunities to save lives and provide care. The O'Boyle Council assists its four parishes (including St. Dominic's), two Catholic schools, the Southwest Waterfront, Navy Yard, and Capitol Hill neighborhoods, and offers men a community to deepen their spiritual life and do good in the world.

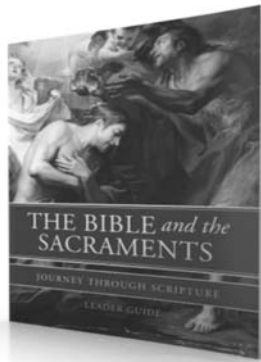
