Anointing of the Sick: Those facing serious illness or entering the hospital.

The other mass parts follow the Gloria.

History: The 4th double window on the north side of the church depicts St. Dominic, Papal Theologian. A few years after Dominic's death, Pope Honorius created the formal office of the master of the sacred palace. Since then it has been the custom for the pope to appoint a Dominican as his official theologian - courtesy of Mary Moran.

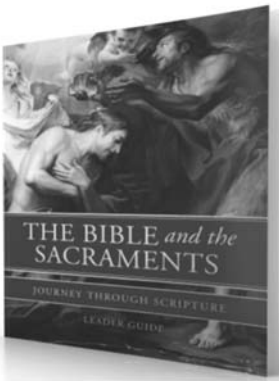
