PASTORAL CORNER



Dear parishioners of St. Dominic,

It's great to be back here in DC with you after my summer of parish ministry in Ohio. As many of you know, I am a deacon assigned to St. Dominic Parish. I got to know many of you last year as I was preparing for my diaconate ordination. After my ordination in March, I had the chance to preach on a few Sundays and serve as a deacon at Mass. This year I will continue to serve as a deacon at weekend Masses and preach occasionally. I will also be helping out with other ministries around the parish, and I look forward to seeing you around.

I grew up in the Seattle area, in a small beach-side town called Indianola. It was a tranquil place to grow up, with a lot of natural beauty, and I still enjoy hiking and bicycling outdoors. After high school I went across the country to Harvard for my college education, majoring in Latin and Greek. I was thinking about a vocation to the priesthood, and these studies did end up helping me in seminary. But I was still unsure about my vocation when I graduated from college, and so I taught for a year in New York and went to graduate school for a year at Notre Dame before entering the Dominicans.

I've been greatly blessed in my first six years as a Dominican. Our vocation of prayer, study, and preaching is a high calling to live up to, but the Lord is also generous with his graces in equipping us for our mission. I am happy to continue my formation in my last year before priesthood as a member of your parish community. Your friendship, support, and prayers are a great help to me as I continue to respond to the Lord's call to be a Dominican priest. I look forward to meeting you for the first time this year or getting to know you better.

To close on a practical note, I won't be able to begin my ministry as a deacon with you until somewhat later in the fall. I recently had a medical procedure done that will require me to be on crutches for an extended period of time. As soon as I'm recovered, though, I will be back serving at Mass. I appreciate your prayers for me in the meantime!

At all weekend celebrations of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, we are singing the Sienna Chant Mass responses starting with the Kyrie (#149) and Gloria (#150) in the Blue Hymnal. The other mass parts follow the Gloria.
