PASTORAL CORNER



Dear St. Dominic's,

Happy Sunday to all of you! I'm Br. Jonah Teller, O.P., a student brother up at the Dominican House of Studies in Brookland. I've been assigned to assist at St. Dominic's for the next couple of years, following in the footsteps of Br. Norbert.

I entered the Order in 2013, came to Washington in 2014, and professed my solemn vows this past February. God willing, I'll be ordained a deacon in March. For this coming year I'll be helping with RCIA classes on Monday evenings and assisting at Masses on Sundays.

By way of background, I'm from Cincinnati, Ohio, the second of seven children (one of my younger brothers is also a Dominican: Br. Simon). My home parish, St. Gertrude's, is where we friars spend our novitiate year when we first enter the Order. I studied English at the University of Dallas and had a number of different jobs before joining the Dominicans, including time spent in the oil fields of North Dakota, working as a short-order cook back in Cincinnati, and teaching literature and composition in San Antonio (I enjoyed that last job the most).

This is actually something of a return to St. Dominic's for me. In 2017 I spent the summer living at the parish and helping with a couple parts of parish life while I was also doing hospital ministry at Georgetown University Hospital. I'm happy to be back!

From Fr. Hyacinth:

What can we do in this moment of crisis in the Church?

Pray: I especially encourage a daily Rosary and Divine Mercy Chaplet, for victims of child abuse and for reform in the Church. Join us for the Evening of Reparation on September 14th at 7pm in the church.

Fast: Give up a meal every week. Make little sacrifices for the Church every day.

Continue to practice your faith: Let familiar ritual help you pray. Persevere.

Communicate: Express your concerns to each other and to your priests. Listen well to others' hurts, struggles, and concerns. Let's help support each other during this difficult time.

Learn: What are the facts? Where is there bias? What good things are being done? What are the true problems? What is the best way to fix them?

Act: Write your bishop. Be charitable and honest. Ask him to invite outside review and scrutiny of processes, to help the Church be better. Having an investigation from the attorney general might be helpful.

WORSHIP

Sung Mass Responses: Our community's sung and spoken responses during the ritual prayers of the liturgy are a core element of our communal prayer. At all weekend celebrations of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, we are singing the Sienna Chant Mass responses which are found in the Blue Hymnal (#149-#154) starting with the Kyrie (#149). The other mass parts follow the Kyrie.

MUSIC MINISTRY: CHOIR AND ENSEMBLE

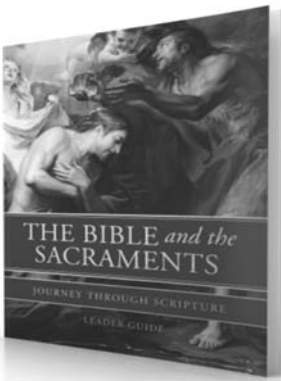
