CHURCH HISTORY

By the time of the Civil War, the Catholic population of Southwest Washington had outgrown the original St. Dominic Church building. On April 10, 1865, the Dominicans met in council and voted to build a new, larger church in southwest Washington, D.C. After vespers on the following Sunday they presented the idea to a group of parishioners, who greeted it with enthusiasm and generosity. A fund of \$10,000 was soon raised.
