

CHURCH HISTORY



The windows of Sts. Peter and Paul may be seen in the main vestibule in the back of the church. Saints Peter and Paul appeared to St. Dominic in a vision and authorized him to preach with apostolic zeal and authenticity. St. Peter is holding the keys given to him by Christ and St. Paul holds the sword that beheaded him. Also note the upside down cross

on the bottom left of St. Peter's window, symbolizing his martyrdom. The armor above St. Paul's head is a reference to Paul's letter the **Ephesians** (6:11).~ Courtesy of Mary Moran

Join us for a Eucharistic procession around the outside of the church property.


Immediately following our procession, all are welcome to a BBQ on the Parish lawn and an opportunity to offer Fr. Bruno your farewell.




