SANCTUARY CANDLE



CHURCH HISTORY

A major fire destroyed the interior of the church in 1885. There was \$30,000 of insurance on the building, but the damage was estimated at \$40,000. There was no insurance on the altars, vestments or furnishings. Catholics and non-Catholics joined the effort to refurbish the interior. The window in the main vestibule honors "The Little Girls" who sold oysters to raise funds for reconstruction.



Singing at Mass: Hymns, Prayers and Responses:

- Our community's sung and spoken responses during the ritual prayers of the liturgy are key parts of communal prayer.
- At all weekend Masses, the Hymns are listed on the boards near the front of the church.
 - ◆ The label "BB" means the music is in the Breaking Bread Book
 - ◆ The label "SM" means the music is in the blue St Michael's Hymnal
 - ◆ The label "Mass" provides you the location of the sung Mass parts (Gloria, Sanctus, etc.).
- Some of our community music is based on easy to remember responses and will not be listed on the hymn board. PLEASE SING ANYWAY!
- Out of solemn respect for the Mass, we follow the custom of remaining at our places within the church until the conclusion of the recessional hymn.
- Please silence your cell phone: As an overt act of courtesy (and respect for the prayer of all), please remember to silence/ turn off your cell phone when you arrive in the church.
