CHURCH HISTORY

Hilborne and Frank Roosevelt (relatives of Teddy and Franklin Roosevelt) operated the Roosevelt Organ Works from 1872 to 1893. In 1887, the Roosevelt Organ Works installed an organ in St. Dominic's Church, tuning it



especially for the superb acoustics of its intended space. In terms of its musical quality, it is tonally unchanged more than a century later, thus being a rarity among the few surviving Roosevelt organs. ~ *Courtesy of Mary Morgan*.

MASS INTENTIONS AVAILABILITY




Dates in 2023 are now available. If the date of your Mass intention isn't important, nor does it need to be
