

From the Pastor's Desk

This past week, we mourned the passing of two of our long-time parishioners, Elysia Branson and Donald Wright. I remember them well from my previous term as pastor here. I do not know the circumstances of their final days nor is my reflection here a judgment about their families. But their passing motivates me to make this reminder and encouragement.

Jesus, through his Church, offers sacraments and prayers to assist and accompany the dying person into eternal life. The sacraments are Confession with the accompanying Apostolic Pardon that remits all temporal punishment due to sin. This special grace can only be given to the dying. The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick asks for the grace of the Holy Spirit and that the Lord would save the person and raise him or her up. Additionally, there are the prayers that commend the dying into the arms of our heavenly Father through the intercession of Blessed Mary and the saints. If possible, the dying person is given Holy Communion as Viaticum so that Jesus truly present in this sacrament will go with the person on the way to God.

These are the provisions of the Church to bring healing, forgiveness, hope, and the strength of final perseverance to the dying. The catch is that the dying person – our loved ones – need us to call the local parish and ask the priest to come to the home, hospital, or other facility. Because of privacy laws, medical personnel and facilities cannot inform the local parish that a Catholic is sick or dying. Do not wait too long if someone is in danger of death or "actively dying" as is said in hospice care. Inquire if there is a priest-chaplain on duty at the hospital; or call the local parish and request the ministry of a priest. We need to advocate for the dying and their spiritual needs as they approach the end of life. In our charity for them, we do not want them to pass over in an unprovided death. Remember, the body remains behind while the soul goes to God. What a gift we can make by helping someone receive the graces of God before that encounter.

The month of November begins this week. It is a month when we remember and pray for all the souls of the faithful departed. There will be a Book of Remembrance at the front of our church to the left of the ambo. You are invited to simply write the name(s) of deceased loved ones and friends so that they may be remembered in the prayers of the parish. The Paschal Candle will burn in this location to remind us that Christ is the Light that overcomes the darkness of death and sorrow. May the souls of the faithful departed through the mercy of God rest in peace. Amen.

WORSHIP

Singing at Mass: Hymns, Prayers and Responses:

- Our community's sung and spoken responses during the ritual prayers of the liturgy are a key parts of communal prayer.
- At all weekend Masses, the Hymns are listed on the boards near the front of the church.
 - ◆ The label "BB" means the music is in the Breaking Bread Book.
 - ◆ The label "SM" means the music is in the blue St Michael's Hymnal.
 - ◆ The Gloria for all Masses is #134 in the St. Michael's Hymnal.
- Frequently, our community music is based on easy to remember responses and will not be listed on the hymn board. PLEASE SING!
- Out of solemn respect for the Mass, we follow the custom of remaining at our places within the church until the conclusion of the recessional hymn.
- Please silence your cell phone: As an overt act of courtesy (and respect for the prayer of all), please remember to silence/ turn off your cell phone when you arrive in the church.
