

Baptism: "Parents are obliged to take care that infants are baptized in the first few weeks" (Code of Canon Law, 867§1). **Matrimony:** A minimum of six months preparation is required by the Archdiocese.

Holy Eucharist at Home: When a fellow parishioner is in the hospital or unable to attend Mass.

Anointing of the Sick: Those facing serious illness or entering the hospital.

Pastor's Corner



As we continue our celebration of the Lord's Resurrection, we call to mind today that his victory over sin and death leads us into eternal life. As we put our faith in him and live in the grace of the Holy Spirit, he will shep-

herd our souls in the way of virtue and holiness. St. Peter teaches us today that "he himself bore our sins in his body upon the cross, so that, free from sin, we might live for righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed."
