



Pastor's Corner



Our faith unites us with Jesus – who today tells us that he is "the way and the truth and the life." He is guiding us to the Father's house where there are many dwelling places – a

place for each one of us prepared by the Lord. This faith of ours steadies us as we live each day because we believe that God is faithful to his promises. Jesus tells us that he will go and prepare a place for each of us and then come back to take us to himself so that we may live in the place where he lives. We live each day with the hope of heaven.

Living in faith and hope are essential qualities of discipleship. We may say that we believe and hope, but these qualities must be activated and put into practice if we are to be sustained by them. Our faith and hope are tested by the many circumstances that buffet our lives each day – at home, at work or at school. We are also tested by temptations and the sinful inclinations that arise out of human weakness. Additionally, we are attracted to the promise of paradise and eternal life. How we respond is the demonstration of our adherence to the person and teachings of Jesus.

"God put us in the world to know, to love, and to serve him, and so to come to paradise" (CCC 1721). Yet, the entrance into paradise requires of us a life-long commitment to the way of the Lord Jesus as communicated to us in the Sacred Scripture and the life of the Church. The eternal life of "beatitude we are promised confronts us with decisive moral choices. It invites us to purify our hearts of bad instincts and to seek the love of God above all else. It teaches us that true happiness is not found in riches or well-being, in human fame or power, or in any human achievement – however beneficial it may be – such as science, technology, and art, or indeed in any creature, but in God alone, the source of every good and of all love" (CCC 1723).

The grace of the Resurrection of Jesus empowers us each day to make the decisive moral choices that keep us on the narrow way that leads to life. Christ has definitively defeated the power of evil, sin and death. He now shares with us the grace of this victory that enables us to choose everything that is good and true. The Lord invites each of us to follow him faithfully and to cooperate with his grace that works in a real and practical way at every moment. Let us renew our personal commitment to follow the Lord Jesus in every facet of our lives as an expression of our faith in him and our hope for the promise of heaven.

Today is Mother's Day – and I extend to all mothers a prayer for an abundance of God's blessings upon you as you are honored and remembered today.
