



Baptism: "Parents are obliged to take care that infants are baptized in the first few weeks" (Code of Canon Law, 867§1). **Matrimony:** A minimum of six months preparation is required by the Archdiocese.

Anointing of the Sick: Those facing serious illness or entering the hospital.

THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE ASCENSION

We celebrate the Ascension of Christ into Heaven this Sunday. So, why exactly is the Ascension so significant? According to Scripture, Christ ascends into heaven in order to...

- Enter into full exaltation and rest with the Father: "Arise, O LORD, and go to your resting place, you and the ark of your might." (Ps 132:8) "So then the Lord Jesus, after he had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven, and sat down at the right hand of God." (Mk 16:19). "I came from the Father and have come into the world; again, I am leaving the world and going to the Father." (Jn 16:28).
- *Show us that He is forever human:* "And when he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight." (Acts 1:9)
- Confirm for us His identity and divinity: "Do you take offense at this? Then what if you were to see the Son of man ascending where he was before?" (Jn 6:61 -62)
- *Illustrate His joyful triumph over suffering and death, both His and ours:* "God has gone up with a shout, the LORD with the sound of a trumpet." (Ps 47:5).
- Be present in a new way, working through the Church to draw all human beings to Himself: "And lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age." (Mt 28:20). "And they went forth and preached everywhere, while the Lord worked with them and confirmed the message by the signs that attended it. Amen." (Mk 16:19-20) "And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself." (Jn 12:32) "Do not hold me, for I have not yet ascended to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God." (Jn 20:17)
- Shower upon us spiritual gifts, above all, the Holy Spirit: "Nevertheless I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Counselor will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you." (Jn 16:7) "Therefore it is said, 'When he ascended on high he led a host of captives, and he gave gifts to men.' (In saying, 'He ascended,' what does it mean but that he had also descended into the lower parts of the earth? He who descended is he who also ascended far above all the heavens, that he might fill all things.)" (Eph 4:8-10)
- *Draw our minds and hearts up to spiritual things, in hope:* "If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at

the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. For you have died, and your life is hid with Christ in God. When Christ who is our life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory." (Col 3:1-3)

- Reveal that from there He will return. And while they were gazing into heaven as he went, behold, two men stood by them in white robes, and said, 'Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven.'" (Acts 1:10-11)
- Highlight our ultimate destination with Him in heaven: God "raised up with him, and made us sit with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, that in the coming ages he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus." (Eph 2:6-7).
