



Baptism: "Parents are obliged to take care that infants are baptized in the first few weeks" (Code of Canon Law, 867§1). **Matrimony:** A minimum of six months preparation is required by the Archdiocese.

Holy Eucharist at Home: When a fellow parishioner is in the hospital or unable to attend Mass.

Anointing of the Sick: Those facing serious illness or entering the hospital.

So I'm grateful for the last few weeks—for your welcome and your kindness, and for God's goodness in sending me here. And I look forward to the weeks ahead—to getting to know you more (and to getting to know more of you!), and to praying with you and being with you, whether in the liturgy, in the various activities of the parish, etc. Please continue to pray for me and for my Dominican brothers, and know of our prayers for you. St. Dominic, pray for us!

History: The windows of Sts. Peter and Paul may be seen in the main vestibule in the back of the church. Saints Peter and Paul appeared to St. Dominic in a vision and authorized him to preach with apostolic zeal and authenticity. St. Peter is holding the keys given to him by Christ and St. Paul holds the sword that beheaded him. Also note the upside down cross on the bottom left of St. Peter's window, symbolizing his martyrdom. The armor above St. Paul's head is a reference to Paul's letter to the Ephesians (6:11). - courtesy of Mary Moran
