



Pastor's Corner?



Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (in Latin, *Corpus Christi*). In this celebration we recall the primary sacrament which Jesus himself entrusted to his Church and commanded that it

be celebrated in memory of his saving passion and death on the Cross. We learn from the Catechism that "the Eucharist is 'the source and summit of the Christian life. The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it. For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself, our Pasch" (CCC 1324). Every time the Mass is celebrated the real presence and saving work of Christ comes to us and is received by us in Holy Communion. He is the nourishment of our souls and fills us with his grace so that we can grow in virtue and holiness.

For our ongoing sanctification and the enhancement of our personal relationship with Jesus, "the Catholic Church has always offered and still offers to the sacrament of the Eucharist the cult of adoration, not only during Mass, but also outside of it, reserving the consecrated hosts with the utmost care, exposing them to the solemn veneration of the faithful, and carrying them in procession" (CCC 1378).

As a parish, we have a weekly time of Eucharistic Adoration every Thursday afternoon from 4:45 – 5:45 p.m. Additionally, there are weekly times of adoration associated with the St. Dominic Cenacle on Tuesdays and the St. Dominic Young Adults gathering on Thursdays. During this Holy Hour we have the opportunity to dwell in the Eucharistic Presence of the Lord in silent prayer. He is present and waits for us to come to him. All parishioners – in fact, everyone – is invited to come and spend this time with the Lord. His Presence and our worship of him will bring renewal to lives and to our parish. His blessings are available in abundance. We have only to come and receive them.

In the cultural calendar, today is Father's Day. It is the opportunity to honor and remember our fathers in gratitude for the many blessings of love, care and provision. The Church teaches us through the Catechism that "respect for parents (filial piety) derives from gratitude toward those who, by the gift of life, their love and their work, have brought their children into the world and enabled them to grow in stature, wisdom, and grace. 'With all your heart honor your father, and do not forget the birth pangs of your mother. Remember that through your parents you were born; what can you give back to them that

equals their gift to you?'[Sirach 7:27-28]"(CCC 2215). So, whether our fathers are living or deceased we have the opportunity to fulfill the Fourth Commandment by expressing our gratitude to God for our fathers and asking the Lord to bless our fathers with whatever graces they need. We can fulfill our responsibilities toward our fathers by assisting them in their material and personal needs; and, if they have died, we can pray for the eternal repose of their souls. With these and other expressions of gratitude, we strengthen familial ties and develop within ourselves an ever-grateful heart.

I will be going on pilgrimage to Lourdes, France to assist with the US National Rosary Pilgrimage to Lourdes for the Sick and Handicapped. I leave on 22 June and return on 1 July. It would be my honor to take your intentions with me and entrust them to Our Lady of Lourdes when I pray at the Grotto of the apparitions. Intentions should be submitted in writing to the parish office by noon on Thursday 22 June. Nevertheless, I will pray for all members of the parish and your intentions. I will pray for the on-going renewal and growth of the parish. Please pray for me and the pilgrims of our group that we will be safe and receive all the graces that God wants us to receive through the intercession of Our Lady and our devotion to her.

Let us pray for one another, Fr. Schommer, O.P.

Church History

History: The 4th double window on the south side celebrates the martyrdom of St. John Gorcum, whose feast day is July 9th. In 1572, the town of Gorcum was captured by extremist Dutch Calvinists. St. John left the safety of his parish and went to Gorcum in disguise to administer the Sacrament to priests who were being cruelly tortured. He was eventually captured and tortured, too. Although the priests were offered freedom in return for denying Catholic teaching, they refused to do so. The site of their martyrdom became a place of pilgrimage. - courtesy of Mary Moran
