Today is the last day of service to our parish community by Brother Peter Gautsch, O.P. Brother has served as deacon here since the end of May. He will continue to live here at St. Dominic's while he completes his last year of

formation in preparation for ordination to the priesthood. As part of that formation, he will minister as deacon at St. Peter's on Capitol Hill. On behalf of the parish, I thank Brother Peter for his service to the parish. We are grateful for his liturgical service and his dedication to the regular duties of parish life.

This past week has been "move-in" day for 8 other deacons. They have moved to the priory from the Dominican House of Studies. Like deacon classes of past years, they will be studying at the DHS and exercising their diaconal ministry at parishes around the DMV. Please welcome these brothers to our parish and neighborhood when you see them.

I invite you to look at our local newspaper – *The* Southwester. The August issue has an advertisement and invitation to our neighborhood community to consider "Becoming Catholic" through the RCIA program that begins in September. Please consider using this ad or the parish flier (Becoming Catholic at the doors of the church) as a help to your own personal invitation to those who may be considering becoming a Catholic or to those who are interested in learning more about the Catholic faith. The primary reason why people have considered becoming a Catholic is that someone extended a personal invitation. This invitation can and should be extended to spouses, siblings, relatives, friends and neighbors. Together, we can all be involved in welcoming people to our parish and to a personal relationship with Jesus Christ in the midst of the Church.

One of the great features of our church is the stained-glass windows. They depict scenes from the life of St. Dominic; and display notable saints of the Dominican Order. It is important that we do all we can to preserve the beauty and integrity of these windows. The interior wood frames and the walls of these windows need to be refurbished; and I'm asking the specific help of parishioners. For a donation of \$2,500, you can cover the cost of refurbishment and have a permanent plaque displayed in gratitude for your donation. History: The 3rd double window on the north side of the church (lower right) features St. Hyacinth (1185-1257), also known as the Apostle of Poland. During a Tartar invasion, St. Hyacinth heard Mary tell him not to leave her statute behind to be desecrated. It was a large statue, and Hyacinth did not see how he could carry it. "I will lighten the load," Mary assured him. With the Sacrament in one hand and the statute in the other, Hyacinth ran through the flames and escaped from the burning convent.
