Pastor's Corner



This past week we celebrated the feast of our parish patron – St. Dominic. The evening solemn Mass was a wonderful, joyful celebration with a large congregation. The singing was vibrant; the homily engaging. The reception following allowed for informal

introductions and the opportunity to build the bonds of community. The occasion caused me to pause and reflect on the abundant blessings we have received in our parish. Parishioners and visitors have commented to me that there is a "welcoming spirit" within our parish. Parishioners are establishing new bonds of friendship praying together, working on projects together, and supporting one another. Visitors tell me that the parish is "friendly" and that they enjoyed their visit. These qualities are a reflection that the divine gift of charity is present and active. This gift is essential for the life and vitality of the parish – because it is the gift that desires the inclusion of family members, friends, neighbors, colleagues, and strangers. As St. Paul says, God "wills everyone to be saved and to come to knowledge of the truth"(1 Tim 2:4). We who have received the gift of salvation and have come to live in the freedom of the truth are thus motivated by charity to welcome anyone who wants to belong to Christ and his Church. This is the essential "outreach" of any parish into the community.

So, I want to encourage every member of our parish to "stir into flame the gift of God" and to continue to greet those familiar and unfamiliar with a smile, a handshake, a word of welcome. In the grace of charity, let us seek the inclusion of those who do not yet know Jesus as Lord and Savior in their lives. Let us be courageous to share our faith and story with others; let us not hesitate to invite people into the Catholic faith. The primary reason why people have considered becoming a Catholic is that someone extended a personal invitation. This invitation can and should be extended to spouses, siblings, relatives, friends and neighbors. Together, we can all be involved in welcoming people to our parish and to a personal relationship with Jesus Christ in the midst of the Church. I remind you that there is a flier at the entrances of the church with the bold title "Becoming Catholic." Please distribute the flier as you extend your invitation to others.

One of the great features of our church is the stainedglass windows. They depict scenes from the life of St. Dominic; and display notable saints of the Dominican
