History: The window high above the Rosary Shrine of St. Jude (South side of the church) depicts the Dominican Emblem. The cross is adorned with "fleur de lis" (lily petals) on the end of each arm. The shield has 8 triangles, 4 white and 4 black, which stands for unity. The Dominican motto is inscribed on the emblem: 'Laudare, Benedicere, Praedicare,' which means "To praise, to bless and to preach."
