



I'm pleased and grateful to be assigned to St. Dominic Parish for my next two years of ministry. I am a student brother in my fifth year who lives at the Dominican House of Studies in Brookland. I am on track to be ordained as a deacon this coming March and to move to St. Dominic

Priory next August. This year I look forward to serving at Sunday Masses, getting to know you at the coffee hour, and helping with the RCIA program on Mondays.

I grew up in the Pacific Northwest, just across the Puget Sound from Seattle. My beachside town is called Indianola and was a peaceful place to grow up. Despite our rain in the winters, we have good weather in the summer and do a lot of outdoor activities. I especially enjoy bicycling and hiking. Other hobbies include listening to classical music and studying languages.

After high school I went to Harvard University for college, where I majored in the Classics. Studying Latin and Greek occupied most of my time, but I also enjoyed learning about the literature, history, and architecture of ancient Greece and Rome. I graduated in 2010 and spent a year working as a part-time teacher in New York. After that I studied theology for a year at Notre Dame and applied to the Dominicans. In August 2012 I entered the novitiate for the Province of St. Joseph in Cincinnati and made simple vows in August 2013. This last February 4th I made my solemn vows at the House of Studies and am overjoyed to be a Dominican for life.
