Pastor's Corner



This weekend, at all of the Masses, we take a moment to recognize all parish employees and lay people with ministerial roles in the parish. Recognition comes in the format of a commissioning ceremony that seeks to celebrate, highlight, and

publicly thank those who dedicate themselves to serving Christ in His mission. Participation in the annual commissioning gives employees and lay people with ministerial roles an opportunity to affirm their commitment to both participate in the work of the church and to "respect our Catholic identity and avoid behavior that contradicts the very mission of the Catholic institution" (Being Catholic Today: Catholic Identity in an Age of Challenge, 14). Our parish is small, but we are blessed with a solid core of dedicated employees and lay volunteers in ministerial roles. It is an honor to commission them this weekend.

The RCIA welcoming evening last Monday went very well. Two non-Catholics interested in learning more about the Catholic faith registered for the program. There has been interest from others as well, but they were unable to attend on the first night. It's not too late to continue to extend an invitation to others and encourage them to follow the Lord Jesus in the Catholic Church. The primary motivation for people to begin this journey of faith is the invitation and encouragement received from another person. Please consider reaching out to family members, friends and neighbors. The parish has a wonderful team of parishioners under the leadership of Fr. Hyacinth who will accompany the participants in their learning, growth, and discernment.

We're making slow progress in the funding of the St. Michael Hymnal. The parish needs 350 hymnals so that they can be available in every pew of the church. To date, the parish has received donations for 96 hymnals. As you know, there is the opportunity to donate a hymnal in memory of someone or in gratitude. We hope to complete the funding process by the end of October so that work can begin in November to put the memorial plates in the hymnals. The new hymnals will be put in the church for use beginning the first Sunday of Advent on 3 December. More information is found elsewhere in this bulletin. Please consider supporting this project.

The funding for the stained-glass window refurbishment is complete. We are grateful to the individuals and groups who have made a commitment to support this project. The painters have begun their work in the church and will continue to move around the perimeter until the work is complete.
