Anointing of the Sick: Those facing serious illness or entering the hospital.

Pastor's Corner



As we live our lives each day, we often come to a moment of changing our mind. We change our mind based upon new information and circumstances; or according to new desires and emotions. Changing our mind changes our actions and behaviors.

The Gospel today portrays for us the change of mind and the change of life that comes when we encounter Jesus. He continually speaks to us through his word, through the teachings of his Church, and through our personal prayer in his presence. Our acceptance of his words and the humble reception of his mercy convince us to change our minds about the way we are living our lives. His words are true and lead us to freedom; his mercy heals the wounds of our past and leads us to the joy of loving him. Our growth in virtue and holiness – an ongoing process in life – depends upon our cooperation with divine grace and the willingness to change our mind. We do well to seek a daily encounter with Christ so that we may live in the Kingdom of God.

A particularly powerful encounter with Christ happens within the context of Eucharistic Adoration. The Real Presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist offers us the opportunity for Jesus to look at us with perfect love and mercy; and for us to look at him with love, gratitude and petition. Before his Ascension into heaven, Jesus promised to remain with us always. In a very tangible way, he remains with us in the Eucharist. Certainly, he comes to dwell within our hearts when we receive him in Holy Communion; but he also waits for us and desires us to come to him before the tabernacle or monstrance.

Our parish has 3 regularly scheduled times for Eucharistic Adoration and I encourage everyone to take advantage of these opportunities. There is a holy half-hour on Tuesday evenings at 6:45 before the Cenacle meeting; a holy hour on Thursdays from 4:45-5:45; and a holy halfhour at 7:00 before the Young Adults meeting. Also, the church is open every day for quiet, personal prayer. Time spent in the presence of the Lord is time well spent. You'll see.
