Pastor's Corner



Next weekend, Fr. Hyacinth and I begin a Sunday homily series on our baptismal identity as Priest, Prophet and King. We will cover one of these characteristics in succession over 3 Sundays. We are presenting

this series as a way of inviting and including the entire parish into the work of parish renewal and planning. On the fourth Sunday of September (the 25th), we will conclude the series. Following all the Masses that weekend, we will invite feedback and input from parishioners. There will be a listening session – in the church – following each weekend Mass. The planned timeframe for the listening session is ½ hour.

Please consider and plan to participate in the homily series and the listening session. The engagement of the entire parish is welcomed and important to our ongoing growth as disciples of the Lord Jesus united in a parish community through his Holy Spirit.

The Shrine of St. Jude on the south side of the church has been a place of prayer and devotion for many years and for countless people. The Shrine is a ministry of the Dominican Province of St. Joseph and reaches out to thousands of people through periodic mailings. In response, people make their prayer requests known and some ask for a candle to be lighted for their intentions. The Shrine "office" is in New York City as part of the work of the umbrella organization entitled the Dominican Foundation.

The leadership of the Shrine has embarked upon a plan of renovation to the Shrine in our parish church. That renovation is scheduled to begin in a couple of weeks. During the time of renovation, the statue of St. Jude and the candle racks will be relocated temporarily until the work is completed. The director of the Shrine has engaged the services of the same architect and contractors who have accomplished other restoration/renovation work in the church. Hence, there will be a continuity in design and craftsmanship between the newly-renovated Shrine and the rest of the church.

I would like to make it clear that no parish monies are being used for the renovation of the Shrine. All expenses are being covered through the Shrine office in New York.

Earlier this week, the Dominican community living in the priory welcomed 6 new members. These men are transitional deacons moving here from the Dominican House of Studies in Northeast Washington. They will continue their theological and pastoral formation at the Dominican House of Studies, here at St. Dominic's under the guidance of their student master

(Fr. John Baptist Ku, O.P.), and at the local parishes where they engage in pastoral ministry as deacon. Our present deacon, Brother Edmund McCullough, now lives here at the parish. He and his classmates are all in preparation for ordination to the priesthood in May 2017.

Nine of the eleven newly ordained Dominicans (who lived here last year) will remain in residence here at the priory and pursue an advanced degree at either the Dominican House of Studies or at Catholic University of America. You will certainly see them around the parish and around the neighborhood.

Except for a couple of guest rooms, the priory is full. This is a great blessing and a testimony that men are responding to God's call to serve him and the Church.
