Pastor's Corner



This weekend is the conclusion of our homily series on our baptismal identity in Christ as Priest, Prophet and King. Over the last 3 weeks, Fr. Hyacinth and I have preached

about this identity and provided handouts during the homily to assist all parishioners in their understanding. (Copies of the handouts are available on the parish website.) The 3-columned chart helps the parish to identify all of its current activities and functions as a participation in the 3-fold mission of Christ. We have also invited all parishioners to take time for prayer and reflection in order to determine how the Lord is calling him/her to embrace more intentionally one's baptismal identity.

Today, after each of the Masses, we will have a "listening session" to receive input and feedback on the homily series; and to understand how parishioners are hearing the invitation of the Lord to follow him. We want to learn from parishioners how the parish can better reflect our baptismal identity; and how the parish can better support the baptismal identity of its members.

Also, today, there is a handout that invites greater participation in the activities and functions of the parish. Everyone is asked to consider how he/she can volunteer in a new way to increase the vitality of the parish and the effectiveness of its mission. Together we can witness to the presence and power of Christ in our community. Together we can experience the abundance of gifts that the Lord has bestowed upon us.

Attention Weekday and Weekend Acolytes, Lectors, Ushers, and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion

All Lay Ministers of the Mass can check their schedule via the MSP App. If your personal commitments change and you need a substitute, please use the MSP "app" or on-line tool to notify other volunteers of the vacancy.

Needed: Parishioners to serve our parish as Lay Ministers of the Mass

We are actively recruiting volunteers to serve as Ushers, Acolytes, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Lectors and Music Ministers. Volunteers are needed at all masses.

- Lectors (those who proclaim the word) are needed to serve at every mass (usually two lectors per mass).
 Lectors are scheduled on an individual basis with consideration given to every volunteer's personal schedules. (Lay Leader of Lectors is Carrie Yauch)
- Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHC) are needed to serve at every mass (at most masses three EMHC are scheduled) (Lay Leader of EMHC is Alice Serar)
- Acolytes are needed to serve at every mass (at least one acolyte is needed to assist the Presider at each mass. When sufficient volunteers are available, three or more acolytes are scheduled to assist) (Lay Leader of Acolytes is Alice Serar).
- Ushers are needed at all masses. Ushers assist with the gathering of the collection and presentation of the gifts.

In a few weeks, new volunteers will be scheduled to receive specific training to the various ministries. Individual training may also be available for those who would like to start serving sooner. Please contact JC Cantrell to register as a new volunteer so that we can confirm dates. Those without email may contact JC via the parish office.
