



THE UPCOMING ADULT GROUP

A little over a year ago we started a young adult group with weekly meetings and a monthly work of mercy. This year we will be starting a similar group for all adults. The all-adult group will meet on Tuesdays, starting on March 7th. We have started planning with a small group of interested people, and we are trying to expand this group as we plan for the launch date. Here is an update of what we have decided so far:

We have decided to meet every Tuesday starting on the first Tuesday of Lent, March 7th, which just happens to be the old feast day of St. Thomas Aquinas, one of our Dominican saints. So, we'll be praying a novena in preparation for that. Each week, we will begin with 30 minutes of prayer in the church, usually having Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament with confession offered, but once a month having a short Mass instead. After the prayer, we will head down to the Parish Meeting Room for a faith-topic discussion. The format will vary. We will incorporate the Bible a lot. We'll have talks, discussions, witness talks, videos, panels, etc. It will be a group of discipleship to grow in our faith together. We will explore and seek to live out all aspects of our relationship with God and our Catholic Faith. We plan to engage in regular works of mercy.

We have decided to call the group "St. Dominic Cenacle." Cenacle is an old word for the "Upper Room," where the Last Supper happened, where Jesus appeared to His disciples risen from the dead, and where the Holy Spirit descended upon the early Church on the Jewish feast of Pentecost. It is a rich and very meaningful image and vision for the group.

The idea of the group is that this would be our main faith formation group for adults in the parish. It will be a chance for parishioners (and non-parishioners) to grow in their faith, pray, get to know each other, and serve together. I am convinced that many good fruits will come out of this. We put it in the hands of Jesus and Mary! There are no membership requirements. All will be welcome to come whenever they can. We will have various lay leaders, in charge of different aspects of the group, guided by us Dominicans as chaplains. Are you interested? We realize that there will be various levels of interest. Some will prefer just to come and try it out at first. Others will want to come when they can, on and off. Others will want to come regularly but would prefer not to take on a leadership role. Others will want to be more actively involved. You'll be hearing more about the group as we get closer to the launch date.
