Dear Parishioners,

Thank you all for your warm welcome upon my arrival to St. Dominic's for the summer. It has been a great first month serving here as a deacon. Your faith and devotion are heartening to see and it has been a pleasure meeting you after Masses, at coffee and donuts, through young adult events, and at the various other goings on at the parish. Fr. Schommer and Fr. Cordell are teaching me a good deal about ministering to the people of God and about the administration of a parish.
